Highlights

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2021 Population Estimates

About the Estimates

The Census Bureau's Population Estimates Program (PEP) produces estimates of the population for the United States, its states, counties, cities, and towns, as well as for the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico. Demographic components of population change (births, deaths, and migration) are produced at the national, state, and county levels of geography.

PEP annually utilizes current data on births, deaths, and migration to calculate population change since the most recent decennial census and produce a time series of estimates of population, demographic components of change, and housing units. The annual time series of estimates begins with the most recent decennial census data and extends to the vintage year.

Tennessee's Population

Statewide, Tennessee saw an estimated population increase of 0.8 percent or 55,099 residents between July 1, 2020 and July 1, 2021 to 6,975,218 residents. This despite a natural decrease in population as there were 7,591 more deaths than births. Migration drove the increase with 63,141 additional residents migrating from out of state. Over 97% of those new residents relocated domestically.

Changes among the Counties

Tennessee's five most populous counties are Shelby, Davidson, Knox, Hamilton, and Rutherford. In these counties reside 2,836,401 residents, just over 40% of Tennessee's population. The next largest 31 counties contain approximately the same number of residents leaving the 59 smallest counties with just over 18 percent of the state's population.

Population declined in only nine of Tennessee's 95 counties in 2021. Among

them were the two most populous. Davidson County's population declined 11,533 residents, or 1.6%, the highest of any county in both absolute and relative terms. Shelby County's population declined 0.5 percent or 4,190 residents. Across the U.S., a similar trend occurred as the four most populous counties all lost residents and eight of the largest ten.

Tennessee's least populous counties were Pickett, Van Buren, Moore, Hancock, and Lake. These counties were home to just under one half of one percent of the state's population. All five of these counties experienced considerable relative growth, ranging from 1.7 percent in Hancock County to 2.9 percent in Moore County.

Sequatchie County added the most residents in relative terms, increasing its population 3.4% while Rutherford added 9,054 residents, the highest absolute increase of any county. If current growth rates persist in Rutherford (2.6%) and Hamilton (0.6%) counties, then Rutherford would overtake Hamilton as Tennessee's 4th most populous county in 2024. As of the 2021 estimates, Hamilton had just under 17,000 more residents than Rutherford.

Natural Increase and Net Migration

Only eight counties experienced a natural increase in population where births exceeded deaths. Those were Bedford, Davidson, Maury, Montgomery, Rutherford, Shelby, Williamson, and Wilson. This is consistent with the national trend where 73 percent of U.S. counties saw a natural decrease. Davidson, Shelby, Obion, and Haywood counties were the only areas to see negative net migration, though all four had positive international migration.

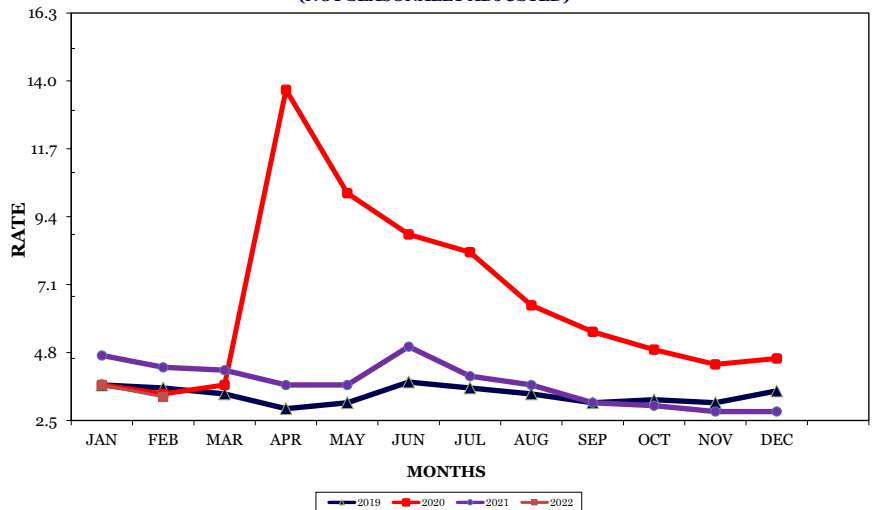

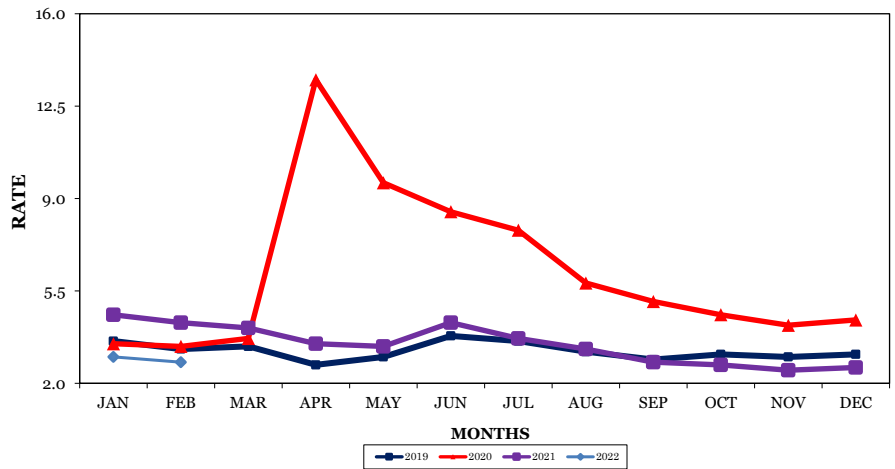

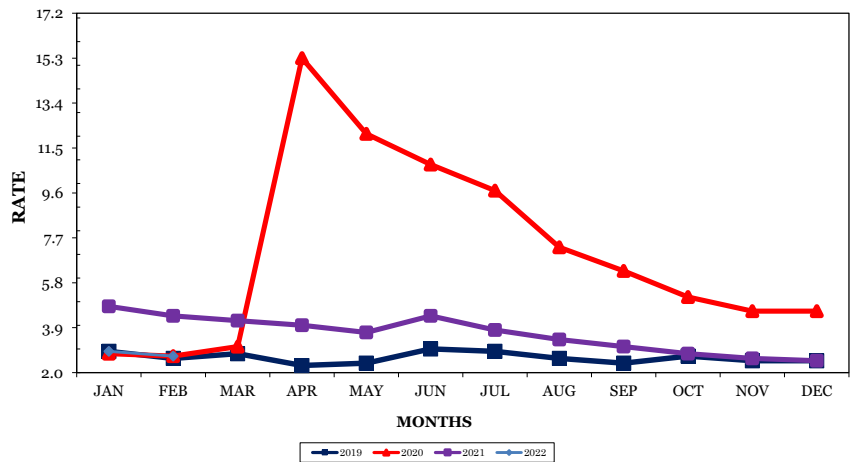
