2024 Geographic Profile of Employment and Unemployment

The Geographic Profile of Employment and Unemployment presents annual data on the employed and unemployed for states and census regions and divisions. The estimates include demographic characteristics, occupation, industry, class of worker, hours of work, duration of unemployment, and reason for unemployment. The source of these estimates is the Current Population Survey.

In 2024, the labor force participation rate for men was 65.5 percent in Tennessee compared to 54.0 percent for women. Women had a lower unemployment rate at 3.0 percent compared to 3.7 percent for men. Across racial and ethnic groups for which data is available, men of Hispanic or Latino ethnicity had the highest labor force participation rate at 84.2 percent and an unemployment rate of 3.8 percent. White women had the lowest unemployment rate at 2.4 percent in 2024. African Americans were unemployed at a rate of 6.0 percent, 5.9 percent among men of this group and 6.1 percent for women. Married women with a spouse present had an unemployment rate of only 1.1 percent. The unemployment rate for the total population age 16 to 19 was 10.9 percent, and the labor force participation rate was only 34.3 percent.

Labor force participation and unemployment differs considerably by educational attainment. For the population age 25 and older, those with less than a high school diploma had a labor force participation rate of 39.9 percent and an unemployment rate of 3.8 percent. In contrast, those with a bachelor's degree or higher participated in the labor force at a rate of 68.9 percent with an unemployment rate of only 1.4 percent. Just shy of 37 percent of the age 25 and older population had a bachelor's degree or higher (36.8 percent) while 37.6 percent either had less than a high school diploma or a high school diploma with no college.

Employment patterns across demographic groups also differ by industry. Among the age 16 and over population, the largest share of employment was in the education and health services sector at 21.5 percent. Men are employed in this sector at a rate of 9.8 percent compared to 34.5 percent of women. Men were most frequently employed in the manufacturing sector at 16.2 percent followed by construction at 14.8 percent. African American workers were most frequently employed in the education and health services sector at 24.2 percent followed by wholesale and retail trade at 13.9 percent.

Across broad occupational groups, 29.1 percent of women's employment was in professional and related occupations, compared to 18.1 percent for men. Over one-third of employment among those of Asian descent was in this occupational group (34.2 percent), while another 16.9 percent was in management, business, and financial occupations. Exactly one-quarter of Hispanic or Latino employment was in construction and extraction occupations.

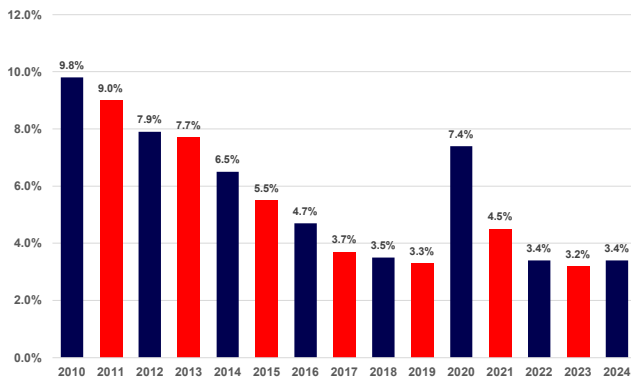

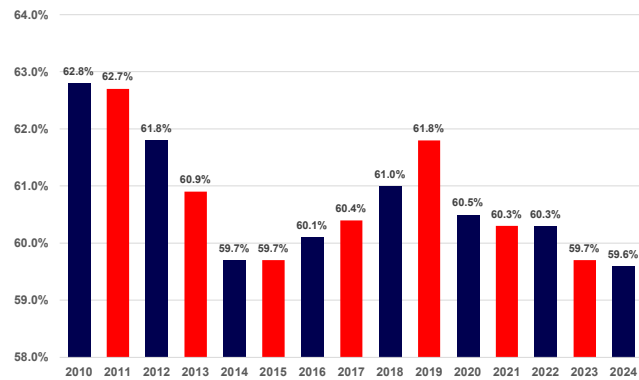

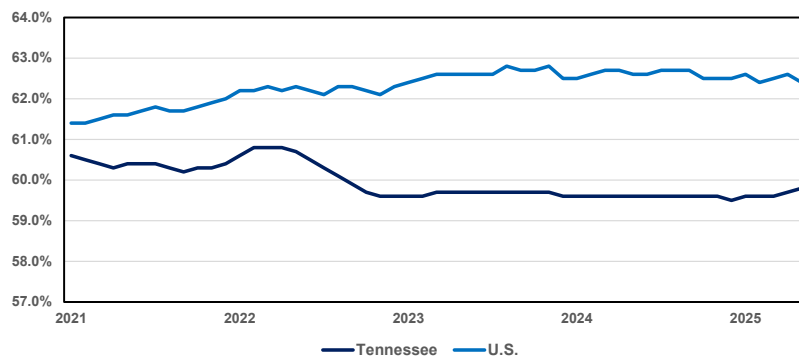
