## Nonfarm Employment & Labor Force Data, 2017-2021

The Bureau of Labor Statistics has two cooperating agreements with states to produce employment and unemployment data for states and substate areas. The Current Employment Statistics (CES) program samples approximately 131,000 businesses and government agencies representing 670,000 worksites in the U.S. The survey is done on a monthly basis by asking for an establishment's employment, hours, and earnings for the pay period that includes the 12th of each month. This data is used to produce monthly nonfarm employment estimates. These estimates provide total employment, by industry, for the state and metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs). This data is compiled based on the employee's place of work.

The second cooperative agreement is the Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS) program. The primary source data is obtained by the Bureau of the Census using a monthly survey of about 60,000 households. From this survey information is obtained concerning an individual's labor force status, such as whether he/she is working or seeking work. This data is then used to produce the monthly labor force estimates for the U.S., states, and substate areas. These estimates include the total labor force, total employed, and unemployed, and the unemployment rate. The LAUS program compiles data based on the employee's place of residence, rather than place of work.

The monthly data for both programs are updated and revised to produce annual averages at the end of each year. Pages 2 and 3 of this edition show the annual averages for Tennessee and each MSA. The nonfarm employment provides a glimpse of growing and declining industries.

### Tennessee Nonfarm Employment

Total nonfarm employment in Tennessee averaged 3,106,100 jobs in 2021. This is 89,600 more jobs than in 2017 and 101,600 more jobs than in 2020. However, this is still 16,000 fewer jobs than the 2019 aver-

age. Among Tennessee's 10 MSA's, only the Cleveland MSA experienced a decline in annual average employment between 2020 and 2021. Four MSA's have employment greater than in 2019: Clarksville, Johnson City, Knoxville, and Nashville.

The industry with the largest absolute job growth from 2020 to 2021 was leisure and hospitality which added 23,400 jobs. Of these 16,500 were in food services and drinking places. The leisure and hospitality industry was hit especially hard by the Covid-19 pandemic, losing 54,000 jobs between 2019 and 2020.

In percentage terms, arts, entertainment and recreation, a sub sector of leisure and hospitality, saw the largest gain between 2020 and 2021 at 14 percent. Beverage and tobacco product manufacturing was second at 10.7 percent.

The average number of employed Tennessee residents increased 129,433 from 2020 to 2021. This helped bring the unemployment rate down from 7.4 percent in 2020 to 4.3 percent in 2021. The 2021 rate lags the 2019

rate of 3.4 percent, however that rate is the lowest annual average rate on record for Tennessee. Compared to 2019, there were still fewer people employed, more people unemployed, and fewer people participating in the labor force. The 2021 labor force participation rate was 60.4 percent compared to 61.9 percent in 2019. The 60.4 percent participation rate for 2021 is the lowest across the latest five year period.

The unemployment rate decreased by over two percentage points in all Tennessee MSA's from 2020 to 2021. However, no MSA unemployment rates were at or below their 2019 levels. The Knoxville MSA had the lowest 2021 rate at 3.5 percent, followed by Nashville at 3.6 percent, and Chattanooga at 3.7 percent. The Memphis MSA had the highest unemployment rate at 6.2 percent.

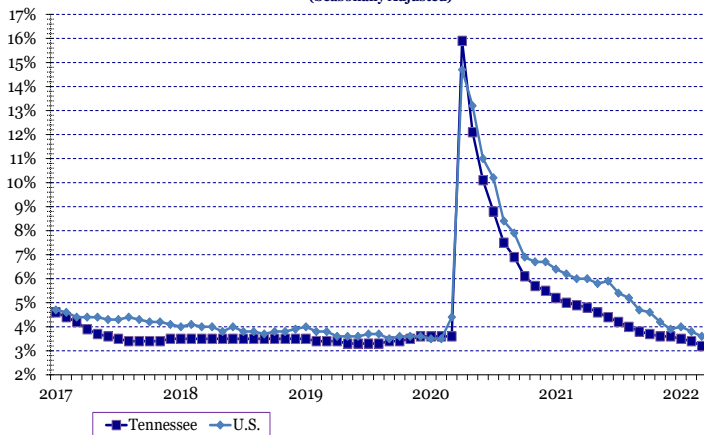
