Teleworking in the United States

Beginning in October 2022, the monthly Current Population Survey (CPS) added questions related to the prevalence of teleworking or working from home for pay. From October 2022 through the November 2023, survey respondents were asked if they teleworked in February 2020 to assess how the prevalence of teleworking may have changed since before the COVID-19 pandemic.

Of the 157,753,000 people at work in the U.S. in November 2023, 20.5 percent reported that they were currently teleworking, while only 10 percent reported teleworking in February 2020. This was the last month respondents were asked about teleworking in February 2020. In September 2024, 23.7 percent of U.S. workers teleworked at least some hours, while 11.1 percent teleworked all hours worked.

Across race and ethnicity, Asian workers were most frequently teleworking at 35.9 percent. Whites followed with 23.8 percent teleworking. Black workers teleworked at a rate of 18 percent, while Hispanics had the lowest rate of workers teleworking at 12.3 percent.

Men teleworked at a rate 21.3 percent compared to 26.5 percent for women. Among workers aged 25 or older with a bachelor's degree or higher, 41.4 percent reported teleworking in September 2024. In contrast, only 9.7 percent of workers who are high school graduates with no college teleworked. Of workers with an advanced degree nearly half teleworked at 44.6 percent. Only 3.8 percent of workers with less than a high school diploma teleworked.

Across industries, 63.7 percent of workers in finance and insurance teleworked and 35 percent teleworked all hours. This was closely followed by professional and tech-

nical services workers, 62.3 percent of whom teleworked. Only 4.9 percent of workers in the accommodation and food services industry teleworked. Next lowest was transportation and warehousing at 9.2 percent.

Among occupational groups, the highest share of teleworkers was 71.8 percent in computer and mathematical occupations. Not surprisingly, only 1.7 percent of workers in food preparation and serving related occupations teleworked.

While national data is available monthly, data for states is only available annually. It shows Colorado as having the highest prevalence of teleworking at 31.7 percent of workers in 2023. The District of Columbia exceeded all states in teleworking frequency by a wide margin with 56.5 percent of workers teleworking. Nationally, 33 percent of federal workers teleworked. In addition to Colorado, seven other states had teleworking rates over 25 percent in 2023. Those were Massachusetts, Washington, Maryland, Virginia, Oregon, Minnesota, and Connecticut. Six states' teleworking prevalence was less than 10 percent: Mississippi, Alabama, Arkansas, South Dakota, West Virginia, and Louisiana.

Tennessee tied with Florida for the 31st highest prevalence of teleworking across the 50 states at 15.3 percent of workers. Of the 489,000 Tennessee workers teleworking, over half teleworked all hours (271,000). This amounts to 8.5 percent of all workers.

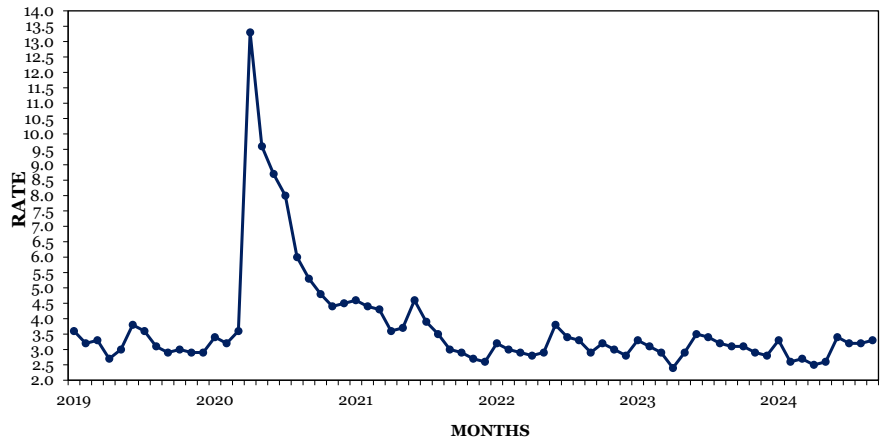

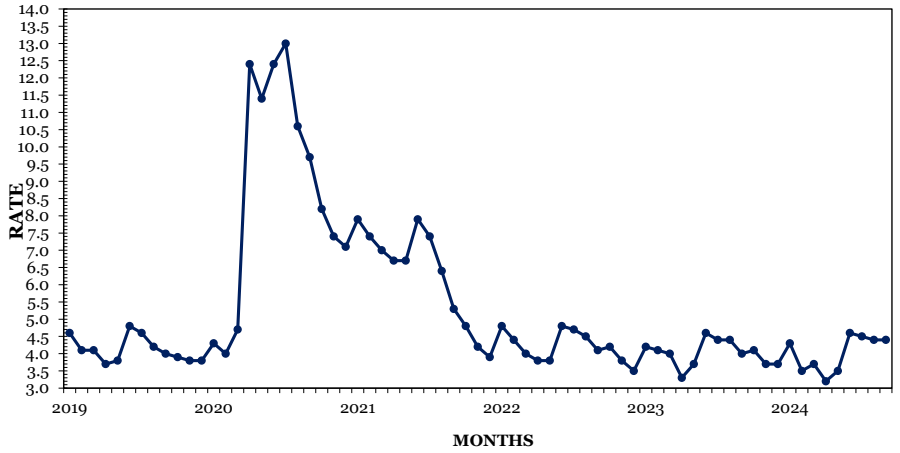

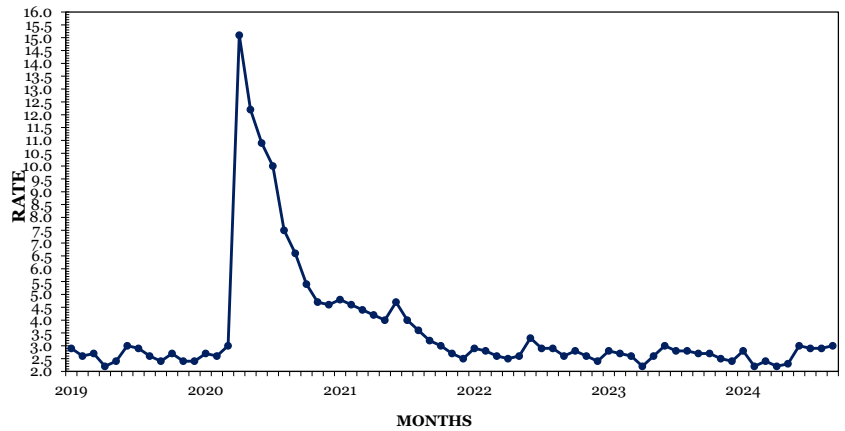

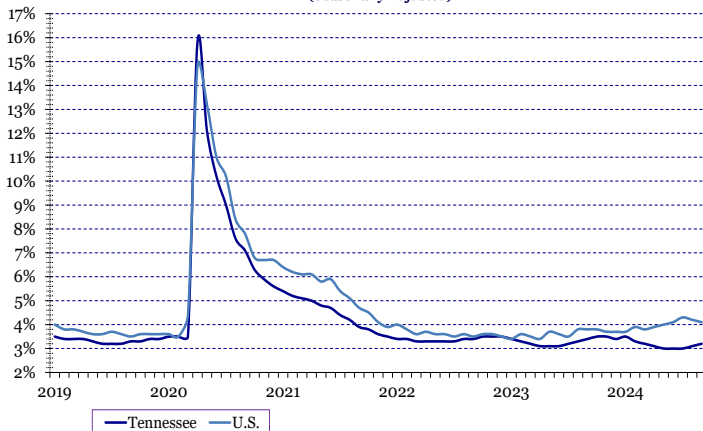
