

Struck By - Inspection #1855302

A 27-year-old male had been working as a Queue Driver for a traffic control company for approximately one month. The traffic control company had closed the left lane of Interstate 24. Just prior to the event, the victim was on the right shoulder of the interstate. An asphalt truck (unrelated to this project) entered the work zone, experienced a tire blow out, lost control of his vehicle and struck the victim's truck. The victim had previously exited the vehicle and was on the right side of his work vehicle. The asphalt truck struck the victim's truck, which struck the victim, killing him.

Citation(s) as Originally Issued

A complete inspection was conducted at the accident scene. Some of the items cited may not directly relate to the fatality.

Citation 1 Item 1 Type of Violation: Other-than-Serious

29 CFR 1926.50(c): In the absence of an infirmary, clinic, hospital, or physician, that is reasonably accessible in terms of time and distance to the worksite, which is available for the treatment of injured employees, a person who has a valid certificate in first-aid training from the U.S. Bureau of Mines, the American Red Cross, or equivalent training that can be verified by documentary evidence, was not available at the worksite to render first aid:

In that no one on-site was trained to render first-aid, and the nearest medical facility was approximately 21 minutes/19.8 miles from the site located at TriStar Skyline Medical Center.
