Personal Income by State

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U.S. personal income continued to decline in the first quarter of 2009, falling 0.5 percent and encompassing 37 states, according to estimates by the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA). In the fourth quarter of 2008, U.S. personal income fell 0.4 percent.

The declines in U.S. personal income were offset by inflation, as measured by the national price index for personal consumption expenditures, which fell 0.3 percent in 2009Q1 after falling 1.2 percent in 2008Q4.

Job losses, lower interest rates, and smaller corporate dividend payments all helped to push personal income down in the first quarter. The decline in personal income was moderated by rising unemployment insurance benefits for displaced workers, cost of living adjustments for retirees, and pay raises for government employees.

Personal income is the income received by all persons from all sources. **Personal income** is the

sum of net earnings by place of residence, rental income of persons, personal interest and dividend income, and personal current transfer receipts.

Of these components of personal income, *net income* declined in all but four states and the District of Columbia. *Dividends and interest* declined in all of the states and *transfer receipts* increased in all states except Alaska.

Personal income in the fastest growing state, Hawaii, was up 0.8 percent, while personal income in the next fastest growing state, Virginia, grew 0.3 percent. Earnings growth in these states was concentrated in the federal, civilian, and military sectors and was accounted for by first-quarter pay raises as well as some initial hiring for the 2010 Census. Seven of the top 10 fastest growing states were in the Southeast. Tennessee was one of those states, as it grew by 0.2 percent.

The largest percentage decrease in personal income, 3.2 percent, was in Alaska, reflecting a return

to normal levels of payments to residents from the Alaska Permanent Fund after a special \$2,000 per person payment to residents in 2008. This is the decline in transfer payments noted above. Personal income fell by more than 1 percent in five other states, including North Dakota, Missouri, and Iowa in the Plains region as sharply lower farm commodity prices reduced farm income.

In many states, one or two industries accounted for the bulk of the decline in earnings: finance in New York, Connecticut, and Rhode Island; durable goods manufacturing in Michigan and Indiana; construction in Arizona and Nevada; mining in Wyoming and Oklahoma; and accommodation and food services in Nevada.

The estimate of personal income in the United States is derived as the sum of the state estimates; and it differs from the estimate of personal income and national income.

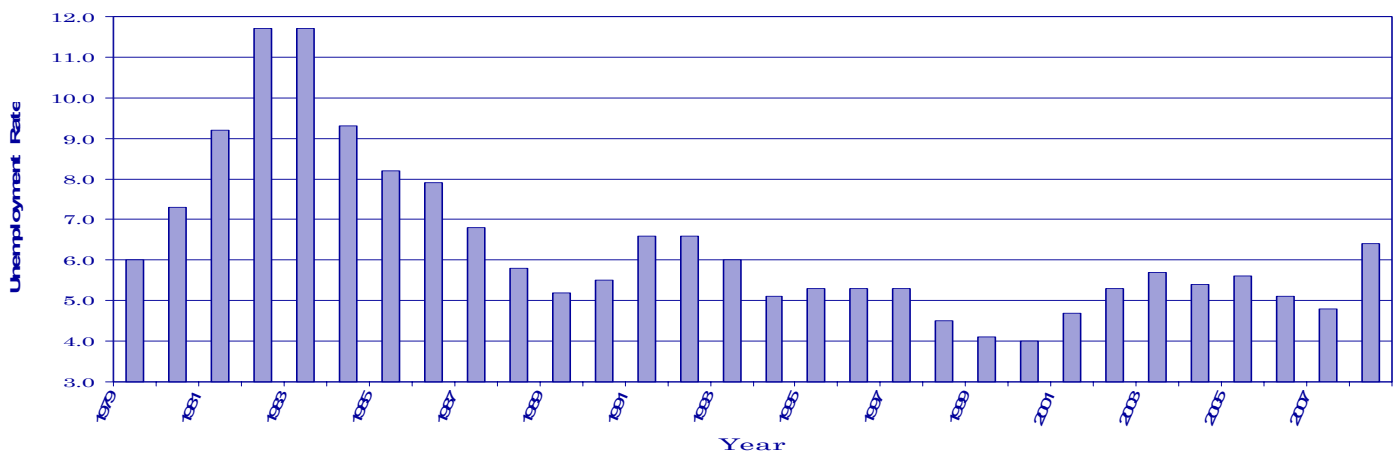

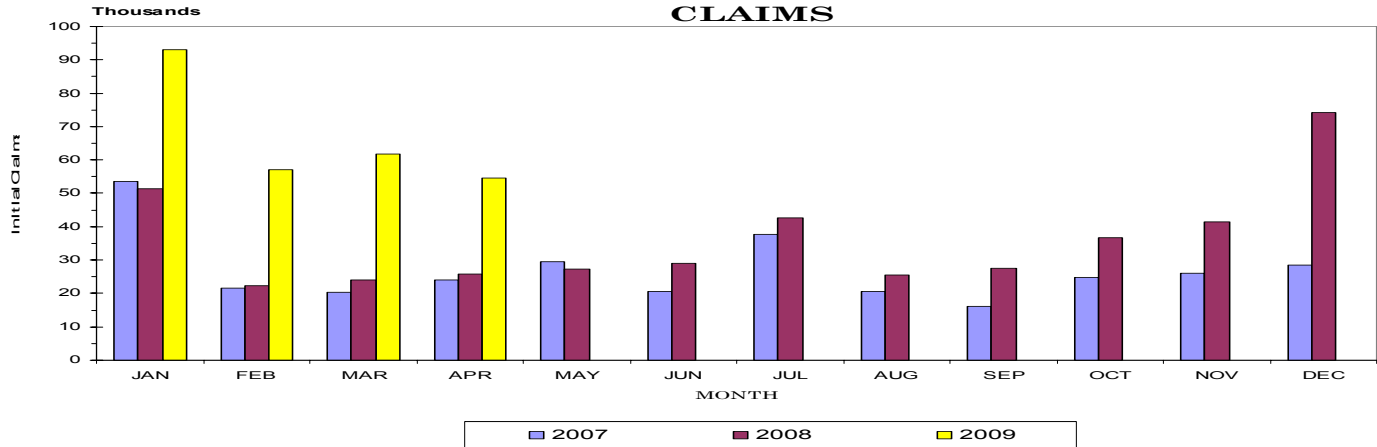
Unemployment Rates 1979-2008

MONTHLY INITIAL CLAIMS



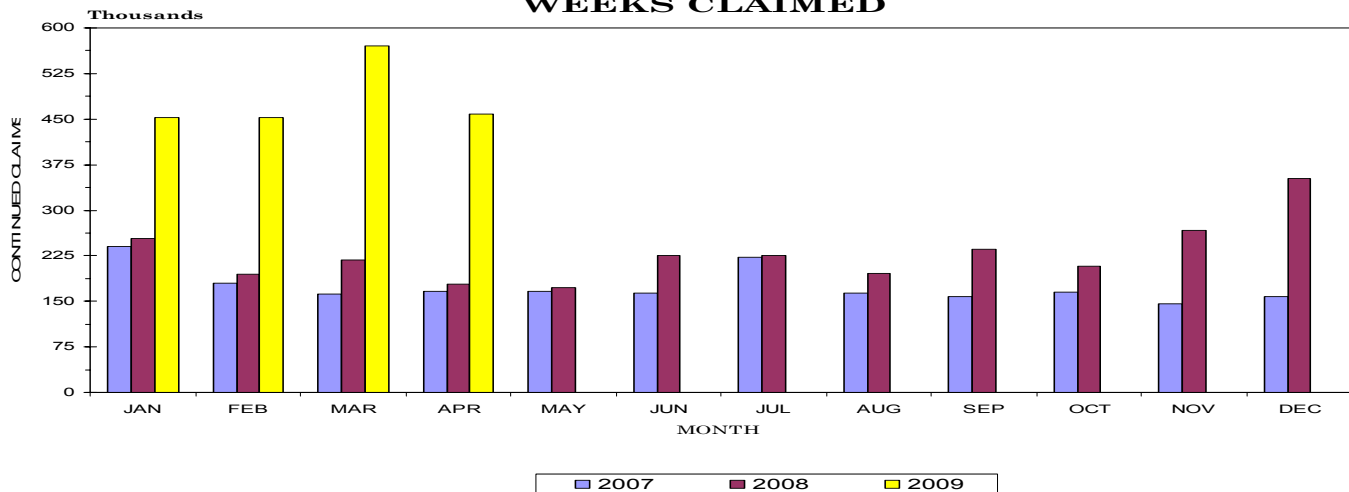

NONFARM EMPLOYMENT AND LABOR FORCE IN TENNESSEE

Total nonfarm employment decreased by 127,400 jobs from April 2008 to April 2009. During this period, there were large seasonal decreases in mining/construction (down 25,400 jobs); professional/business services (down 21,000 jobs), which includes a decline of 16,400 jobs in administrative/support/waste management; retail trade (down 13,600 jobs), which includes declines of 3,200 jobs in motor vehicle/parts dealers and 3,100 in general merchandise stores; transportation equipment manufacturing (down 10,400 jobs); transportation/warehousing (down 8,200 jobs), which includes a drop of 5,700 jobs in truck transportation; financial activities (down 7,300 jobs), which includes a decrease of 5,100 jobs in finance/insurance and 2,200 jobs in real estate/rental/leasing; wholesale trade (down 7,000 jobs), which includes a decline of 4,500 jobs in durable goods wholesalers and 2,200 jobs in nondurable goods wholesalers; leisure/hospitality (down 6,200 jobs), which includes a drop of 4,500 jobs in accommodation/food services; fabricated metal product manufacturing (down 5,100 jobs); information (down 3,800 jobs); and other services and plastics/rubber products manufacturing (both down 3,200 jobs). This was partially offset by increases in health care/social assistance (up 9,400 jobs), which includes an increase of 5,700 jobs in hospitals and 4,000 jobs in ambulatory health care services; and local government (up 1,700 jobs).

During April, nonfarm employment increased by 2,600 jobs. The largest seasonal increases were in leisure/hospitality (up 6,300 jobs), which includes an increase of 3,500 jobs in accommodation/food services and 2,800 jobs in arts/entertainment/recreation; and retail trade (up 1,100 jobs). This was partially offset by decreases in professional/business services (down 1,800 jobs), and educational/health services and wholesale trade (both down 1,500 jobs).

Tennessee's seasonally adjusted estimated unemployment rate for April 2009 was 9.9 percent, up 0.3 percent from the March rate. This is the 21st consecutive month that the current rate is greater than or equal to the national average.

The United States' unemployment rate was 8.9 percent in April 2009. In April 2008, the national unemployment rate was 5.0 percent, and the state's unemployment rate was 6.0 percent.

Across Tennessee, the unemployment rate decreased in 59 counties, increased in 29 counties, and remained the same in seven counties. There were only 26 counties with an unemployment rate less than 10 percent, and eight counties had unemployment rates greater than 15 percent. The lowest rate occurred in Lincoln County at 6.3 percent, down 0.5 percent from the previous month. The highest rate was Perry County's 23.9 percent, down from 25.6 percent in March 2009.

The data from all the nonfarm employment estimates tables include all full- and part-time nonfarm wage and salary employees who worked during or received pay for any part of the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. This is a count of jobs by place of work. Agricultural workers, proprietors, self-employed persons, workers in private households, and unpaid family workers are excluded. These numbers may not add due to rounding. Data is based on the 2008 benchmark.

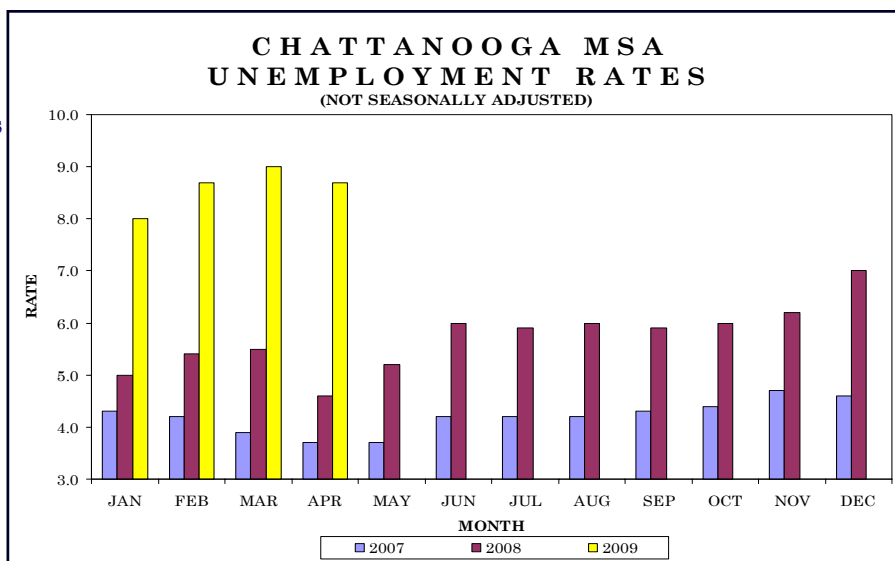

Total nonfarm employment remained unchanged from March 2009 to April 2009. There was a seasonal increase in leisure/hospitality (up 400 jobs), which includes an increase of 200 jobs in accommodation/food services. This was completely offset by declines of 200 jobs in both retail trade and local government.

During the past 12 months, nonfarm jobs decreased by 5,800. During that time, goods-producing jobs decreased by 3,400, while service-providing jobs declined by 2,400.

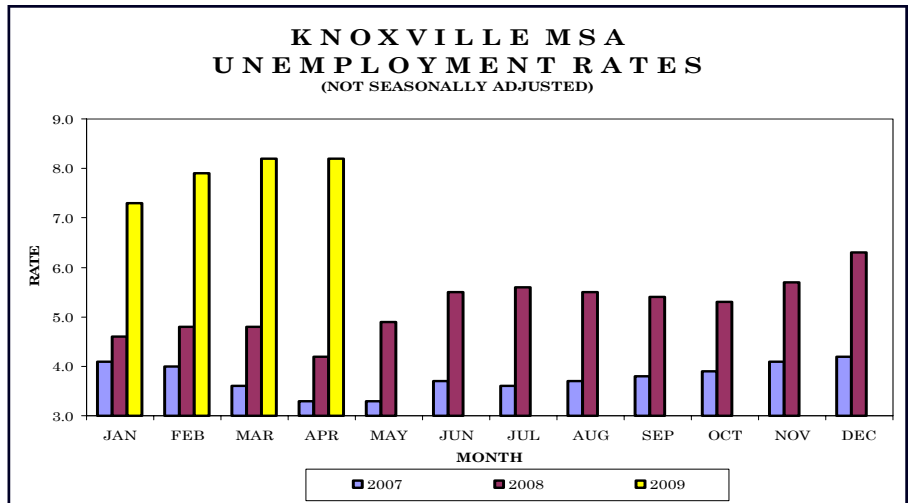

Total nonfarm employment increased by 600 jobs from March 2009 to April 2009. There were seasonal increases in leisure/hospitality (up 500 jobs), which includes an increase of 400 jobs in accommodation/food services; professional/business services (up 400 jobs), which includes an increase of 300 jobs in administrative/support/waste management; and state government (up 200 jobs). This was partially offset by a decrease of 700 jobs in durable goods manufacturing.

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment decreased by 11,700 jobs. During that time, goods-producing jobs decreased by 6,100, while service-providing jobs declined by 5,600.

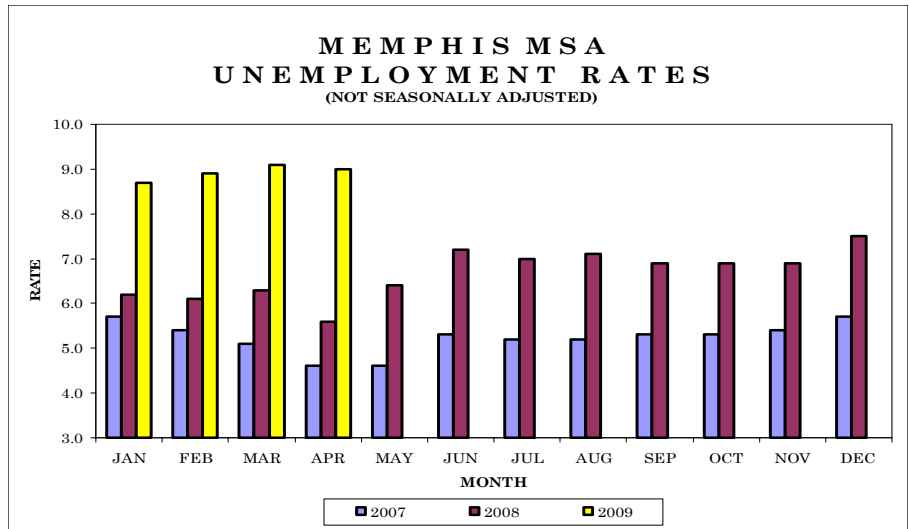

Total nonfarm employment decreased by 200 jobs from March 2009 to April 2009. There were seasonal declines in transportation/warehousing/utilities (down 500 jobs); retail trade (down 400 jobs), which includes a decrease of 300 jobs in general merchandise stores; educational/health services (down 300 jobs), which includes a decrease of 200 jobs in health care/social assistance; professional/business services (down 300 jobs); and wholesale trade (down 200 jobs). This was partially offset by increases in accommodation/food services (up 700 jobs), mining/construction (up 500 jobs), and federal government (up 200 jobs).

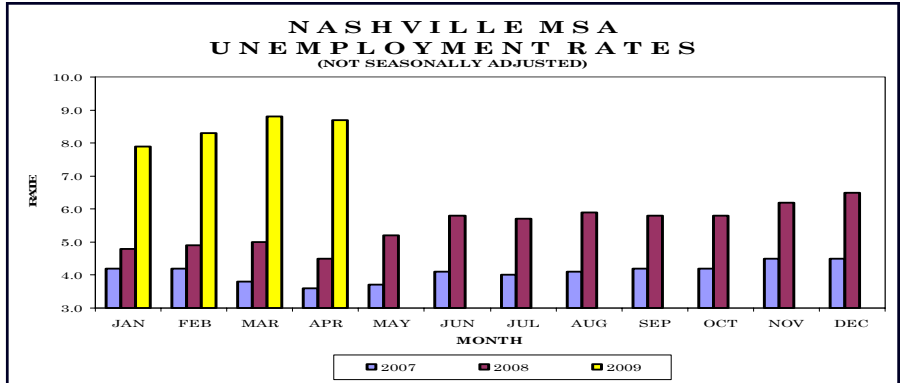

This was partially offset by increases in leisure/hospitality (up 700 jobs), which includes increases of 500 jobs in arts/entertainment/recreation and 200 jobs in accommodation/food services; administrative/support/waste management (up 600 jobs); retail trade (up 300 jobs); and educational services (up 200 jobs).
