Tennessee Short-Term Projections 2023-2025


From a base of 3.4 million jobs in 2023, total employment for Tennessee, including agricultural, self-employed, and private household workers, is expected to grow to 3.6 million by 2025. Employment is expected to increase by 2.3 percent annually, as employment continues to recover from lower employment in the base year of 2020 due to the pandemic. Health care and social assistance is expected to remain the largest sector, forecast to have nearly 439,000 jobs by 2025.


Second in employment size is expected to be the manufacturing sector, which is projected to continue to experience significant job growth in the state of Tennessee. There are several factors in the state's economic landscape that have led to this sector's growth. The motor vehicle manufacturing industry cluster has been the beneficiary of multiple investments by the state of Tennessee and the U.S. government, especially for electric vehicle manufacturing and related industries. It is one of the faster-growing industries in Tennessee and is expected to reach nearly 25,500 employment in 2025. In September 2022, Ford broke ground on an EV campus in Stanton, Tennessee. That same month, Bridgestone announced a \$550 million investment to expand their tire plant in Morrison in Warren County. Tennessee has also attracted foreign investment from Korea and Australia. LG Chem, the Korean-based company, is building a cathode plant in Clarksville. A variety of incentives are available to manufacturers from the state to locate in Tennessee (https://www.tn.gov/transparenttn/statefinancial-overview/open-ecd/openecd/ openecd-tax-incentives.html).

Because of these factors, motor vehicle manufacturing is projected to experience job growth of 12.8% by 2025, to a total of 25,500 jobs from a base of 20,000 jobs in 2023. The most rapidly growing

industries include media streaming distribution services and content providers, social networks, and other media networks (20.3 percent) as well as computer and peripheral equipment manufacturing (18.5 percent). Financial services industries growing faster than average include automotive equipment rental and leasing, insurance carriers, and non-depository credit intermediation. More rapidly growing business services include the industries of architectural engineering and related services, management and scientific consulting, and scientific research and development. Retail trade and accommodation and food services continue to increase as the population grows.

Occupations in the state that are projected to experience notable growth by 2025 in both employment and percentage, particularly in the industries mentioned above, include: business and financial operations occupations (14,450 jobs, 4.4 percent annual growth), computer and mathematical occupations (7,560 jobs, 4.9 percent annual growth), and architecture and engineering occupations (5,380 jobs, 5.9 percent annual growth). These occupations are currently projected to grow faster than the state's average through 2025. Comptia, a leading accreditor for IT certifications, identifies new advances in Al, data governance, advances in cloud architecture, increased needs for information security, and more businesses relying on data-driven decisions as important reasons for IT growth (https:// connect.comptia.org/content/research/itindustry-trends-analysis). With the increasing construction of multi-family residential as well as hotel properties, buildings and grounds and cleaning and maintenance occupations are growing rapidly at 3.6 percent. Healthcare support and healthcare practitioners are together expected to create more than 16,590 jobs over the two-year period.






