Department of Labor & Workforce Development

2021 Tennessee Occupational Employment & Wages

The Tennessee Department of Labor and Workforce Development (TDLWD), in cooperation with the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), produces annual occupational employment and wage data. Using data collected by TDLWD from employers throughout Tennessee, the BLS has released data for May 2021.

Tennessee Occupations & Wages

Tennessee's May 2021 average annual wage was \$49,330, up \$1,800 from \$47,530 in May 2020. The median wage in Tennessee also increased from \$37,440 in May 2020 to \$37,700 in May 2021.

Among the major occupational groups, the most jobs were in office and administrative support occupations. At 422,210 jobs, this was 14.1% of all jobs in Tennessee. The median annual wage in this group was \$37,080. Within this group, customer service representatives was the most common occupation at 68,340 jobs. This was the fourth highest employment of any occupation in the state. The median annual wage was \$36,040. The highest paying occupation in this group with over 300 employment was executive secretaries and executive administrative assistants with a median annual wage of \$59,050. Among the lowest paying occupations were hotel, motel and resort desk clerks (\$23,150) and switchboard operator, including answering service (\$28,820).

The occupational group with the highest median annual wage was management occupations (\$97,680), while food preparation and serving related occupations were the lowest at \$22,540.

The occupation with the highest median annual wage, across all occupations, was family medicine physician at \$196,570. Healthcare practitioner occupations accounted for the seven highest median wages in Tennessee. As a group, healthcare practitioners and technical occupations represented 204,810 jobs statewide with a me-

dian annual wage of \$60,890. The lowest paying occupation in this group with more than 300 employment was psychiatric technicians (\$29,650), which is only 15.1% of the median wage for family medicine physicians. At 62,250 employment, registered nurse was the most common occupation in this group, accounting for over 30 percent of its total employment. The median annual wage for registered nurses was \$62,390.

The most common occupation in Tennessee was retail salesperson with total employment of 82,570, followed by laborers, freight, stock, and material movers (78,430 employment), and stockers and order fillers (73,840 employment). These three occupations comprised 7.9 percent of statewide employment.

The occupations with the lowest median annual wages in the state were entertainment attendants and related workers, all other (\$17,800), waiters and waitresses (\$18,230), and ushers, lobby attendants, and ticket takers (\$18,260).

Production occupations had a total employment 257,180 and a median annual wage of \$37,370. Nuclear power reactor operators had the highest median wage at \$98,920 and a total employment of 340 statewide. Laundry and dry-cleaning workers had the lowest median annual wage in the group at \$22,820 and a total employment of 3,210.

Metropolitan Statistical Areas

Across Tennessee's ten Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSA's), only the Nashville and Memphis MSA's had a median annual wage higher than the state median at \$39,260 and \$37,790, respectively. The Nashville MSA also had a total employment of 976,900, almost one-third of total statewide employment. The Cleveland and Morristown MSA's tied for the lowest median annual wage at \$35,200.






