The Labor Market Report

County Population Estimates 2010-2014

The 2010 Tennessee Census population was 6,346,105. The Bureau of the Census estimated the 2014 population of Tennessee at 6,549,352, up 203,247 (3.2 percent) from the 2010 Census. The decennial Census is an actual population count, but the Census Bureau also produces yearly estimates of state, county, and city populations as of July 1. The estimation methodology has remained unchanged for over two decades and can be obtained online at <http://census.gov/popest/methodology/index.html>.

County Population

The counties with the greatest population are: Shelby County (938,803 people), Davidson County (668,347 people), Knox County (448,644 people), Hamilton County (351,220 people), Rutherford County (288,906 people), Williamson County (205,226 people), Montgomery County (189,961 people), and Sumner County (172,706 people). The smallest counties are: Pickett County (5,124 people), Van Buren County (5,633 people), Moore County (6,319 people), Hancock County (6,657 people), and Lake County (7,631 people). From 2010 through the 2014 population estimate the largest actual growth occurred in Davidson County (up 41,666 people), Rutherford County (up 28,302 people), Williamson County (up 22,044 people), Montgomery County (up 17,630 people), and Knox County (up 16,418 people). These five counties had a total population increase of 124,060. While these counties consist of 27.5 percent of the state's 2014 population they accounted for 61 percent of the growth.

During the past four years, Williamson County had the largest percentage increase (up 12.0 percent), followed by Montgomery County (up 10.2 percent), Rutherford County (up 10.0 percent), Wilson County (up 10.0 percent), and Bledsoe County (up 8.2 percent). The top four counties are in Middle Tennessee.

Population has declined in 44 Tennessee counties since 2010. The largest numeric and percentage declines were in Roane County (down 1,433 people, -2.6 percent), Hardeman County (down 1,288 people, -4.7 percent), Obion County (down 866 people, -2.7 percent), and Campbell County (down 798 people, -2.0 percent).

There were three counties whose population declined from the 2000 Census to 2014. They are Lake County (down 323 people), Clay County (down 211 people), and Hancock County (down 129 people).

County Ranking

The rankings for the very largest and smallest counties have not changed since 2010. However, Sullivan County's population was ranked 6th largest in 2000 and 9th in 2014. Williamson County's population was ranked 9th in 2000 and 6th in 2014. These were the only changes in the population ranking of the nine largest Tennessee counties in the last 14 years. During that same time, the four smallest counties remained the same. However, Lake County has gone from the 88th largest (in 2010) to the 91st largest county (in 2014) while Trousdale County has gone from the 91st largest to the 88th largest county.

There are 3,142 counties in the United States, on which 43 have a population greater than one million. The county with the largest population is Los Angeles County, California (10,116,705 people). The county with the smallest population is Loving County, Texas (86 people, it is south of Carlsbad, NM). In Tennessee, the county with the largest population is Shelby County (ranked 51st) while the smallest county is Pickett County (ranked 2,832nd).

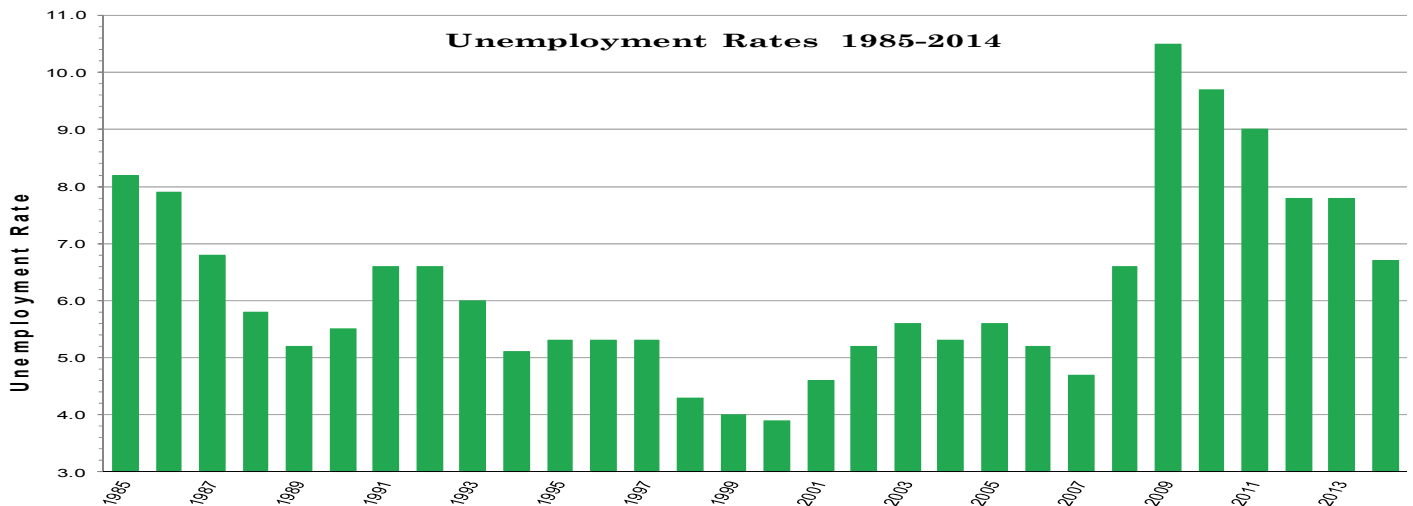

NONFARM EMPLOYMENT & LABOR FORCE NARRATIVE

Total nonfarm employment increased by 62,300 jobs from July 2014 to July 2015. There were large increases in professional/business services (up 12,700 jobs), which includes increases of 9,200 jobs in administrative/support/waste management and 2,000 jobs in professional/scientific/technical services; retail trade (up 8,700 jobs), which includes increases of 1,900 jobs in motor vehicle/parts dealers and 1,600 jobs in sporting goods/hobby/book/music stores; and food services/drinking places (up 8,000 jobs). There were smaller increases in health care/social assistance (up 5,900 jobs), which includes increases of 4,900 jobs in ambulatory health care services, 2,200 jobs in hospitals, combined with a decline of 1,000 jobs in nursing/residential care facilities; transportation/warehousing (up 4,700 jobs); transportation equipment manufacturing (up 4,500 jobs); wholesale trade (up 4,100 jobs), which includes increases of 2,000 jobs in durable goods wholesalers and 1,700 jobs nondurable goods wholesalers; arts/entertainment/recreation (up 3,400 jobs); mining/logging/construction (up 2,800 jobs); and financial activities (up 2,200 jobs), which includes an increase of 1,500 jobs in finance/insurance.

During July 2015, nonfarm employment decreased by 12,100 jobs. There were declines in administrative/support/waste management (down 5,200 jobs), local government, (down 2,200 jobs), educational services (down 1,800 jobs), state government (down 1,500 jobs), food services/drinking places (down 1,400 jobs), and social assistance (down 1,000 jobs). This was partially offset by increases in ambulatory health care services (up 1,500 jobs) and wholesale trade (up 1,000 jobs).

Tennessee's seasonally adjusted estimated unemployment rate for July 2015 was 5.7 percent, unchanged from the revised June 2015 rate. The United States unemployment rate in July was 5.3 percent, also unchanged from the revised June 2015 rate.

In July 2014, the national unemployment rate was 6.2 percent while the state rate was 6.6 percent.

Across Tennessee, the unemployment rate increased in 53 counties, decreased in 21 counties, and remained the same in 21 counties. There were two counties with a rate below 5 percent and two counties with a rate above 10 percent in July. They are Williamson County (4.6 percent), Davidson County (4.9 percent), Hancock County (12.9 percent), and Scott County (11.5 percent).

The data from all the nonfarm employment estimates tables include all full- and part-time nonfarm wage and salary employees who worked during or received pay for any part of the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. This is a count of jobs by place of work. Agricultural workers, proprietors, self-employed persons, workers in private households, and unpaid family workers are excluded. These numbers may not add due to rounding. Data are based on the 2014 benchmark.

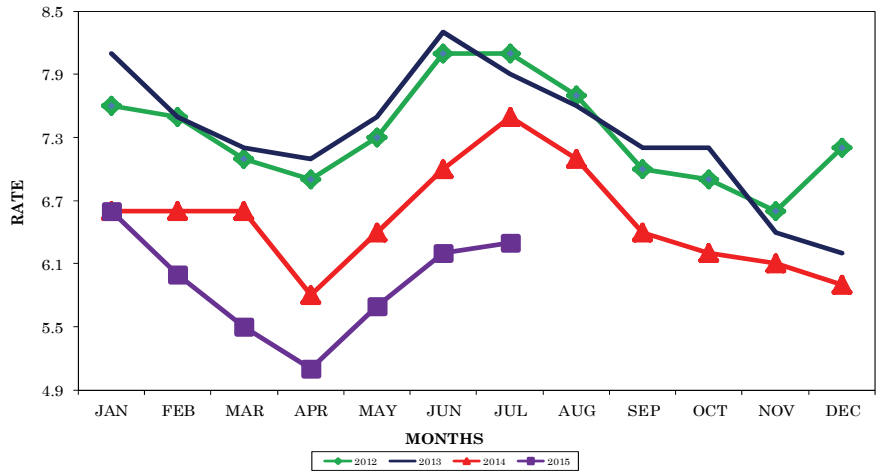

Total nonfarm employment decreased by 500 jobs from June 2015 to July 2015. There were declines in leisure/hospitality (down 400 jobs), and retail trade and manufacturing durable goods (both down 300 jobs). This was partially offset by increases of 400 jobs in professional/business services and 200 jobs in financial activities.

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment increased by 5,900 jobs. During the year, goods-producing jobs increased by 400 while service-providing industries jobs increased by 5,500.

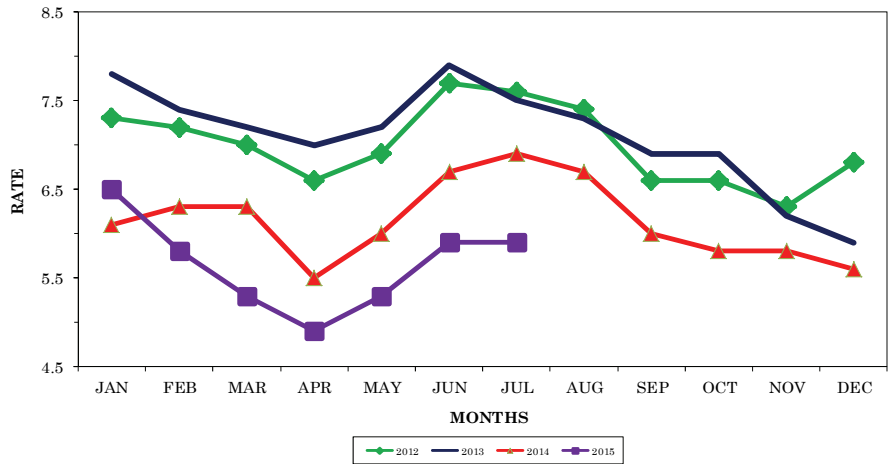

Total nonfarm employment decreased by 2,300 jobs from June 2015 to July 2015. There were declines in mining/logging/construction (down 800 jobs); local government (down 500 jobs); state government and leisure/hospitality (both down 300 jobs); and professional/business services and trade/transportation/utilities (both down 200 jobs).

Over the past 12 months, nonfarm employment increased by 11,900 jobs. During that time, goods-producing jobs increased by 1,900 jobs, while service-providing jobs increased by 10,000.

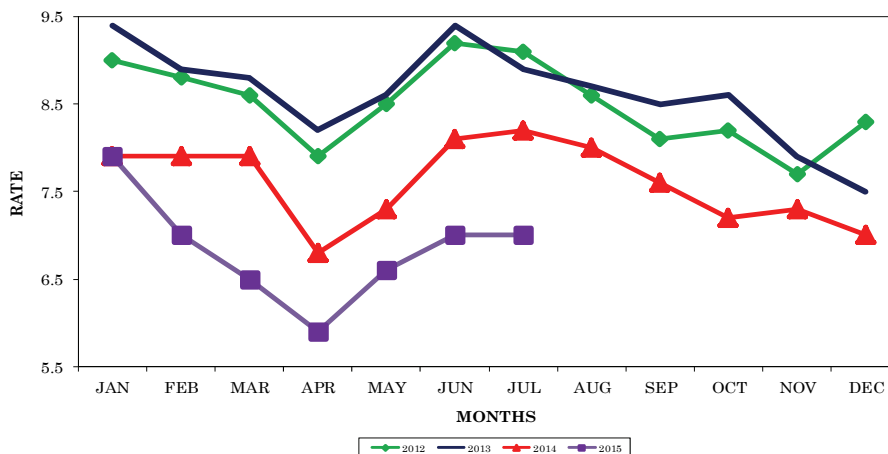

Total nonfarm employment decreased by 2,000 jobs from June 2015 to July 2015. There were seasonal declines in trade/transportation/utilities (down 1,600 jobs), which includes decreases of 1,200 jobs in retail trade and 600 jobs in transportation/warehousing/utilities combined with an increase of 200 jobs in wholesale trade; leisure/hospitality (down 700 jobs); administrative/support/waste management (down 600 jobs); professional/business services (down 500 jobs); educational/health services (down 300 jobs); and state government (down 200 jobs). These were partially offset by increases in financial activities (up 600 jobs), nondurable goods manufacturing (up 300 jobs), and local government and other services (both up 200 jobs).

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment increased by 8,900 jobs. During that time, goods-producing jobs declined by 600, while service-providing jobs increased by 9,500.

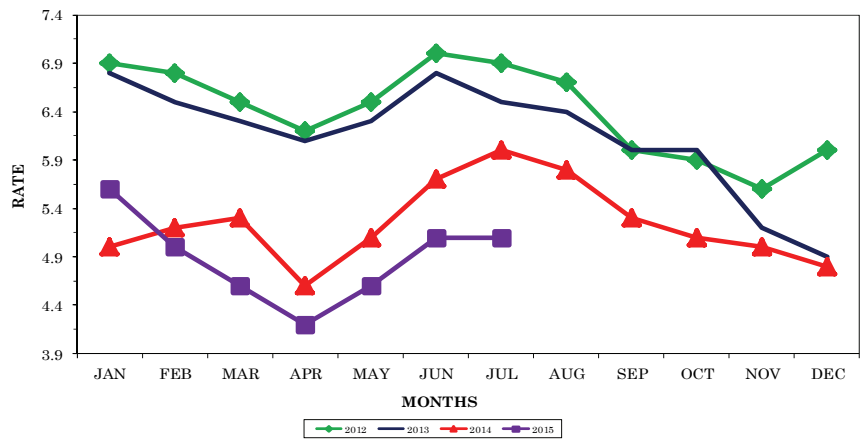

Total nonfarm employment decreased by 3,800 jobs from June 2015 to July 2015. There were declines in leisure/hospitality (down 1,300 jobs), financial activities (down 1,000 jobs), durable goods manufacturing (down 900 jobs), educational services (down 800 jobs), local government (down 700 jobs), administrative/support/waste management (down 600 jobs), and retail trade and transportation/warehousing/utilities (both down 500 jobs).

These were partially offset by increases in health care/social assistance (up 700 jobs); wholesale trade (up 600 jobs); and mining/logging/construction, other services, management of companies/enterprises, and state government (each up 200 jobs).

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment increased by 31,200 jobs. During that time, goods-producing jobs increased by 6,400, while service-providing jobs increased by 24,800.

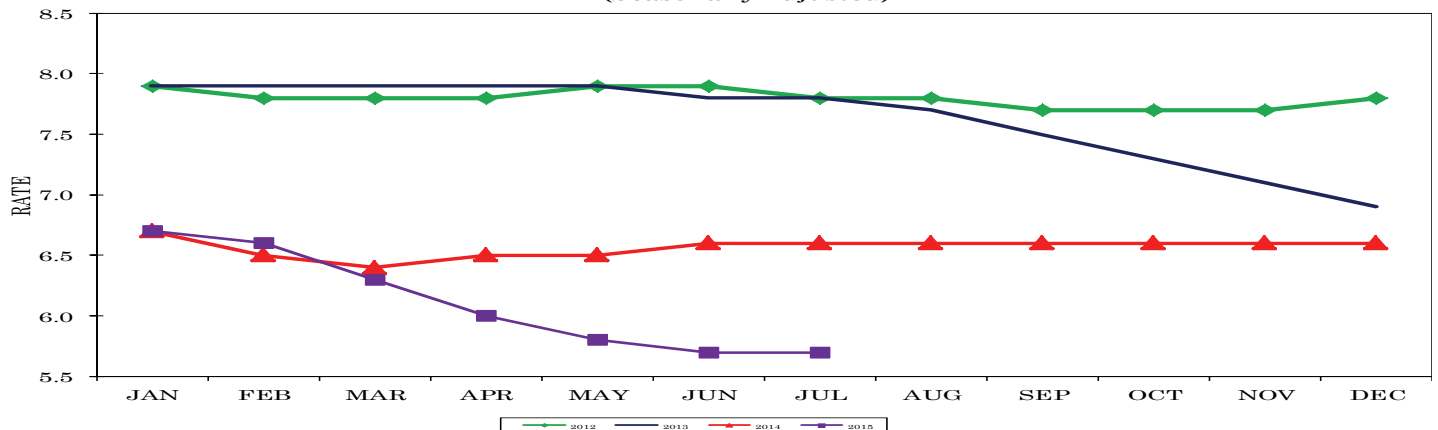
