What is WIR²ED?

- WIR²ED was created November 1, 2017 and includes the following sections:
 - Labor Market Information staff working in cooperation with the Bureau of Labor Statistics to conduct the surveys and censuses that produce economic indicators
 - Customer Success Team
 - End user support for all divisions
 - Data Analytics and Technical Support Team
 - Combine statistical, historical and real time data (Jobs4TN.gov) to provide dashboards, charts, graphs, etc to support data driven decision making
 - How will technology affect the workforce of the future? What skills will be needed? Which jobs will be replaced by automation?



What is WIR²ED?

Labor Market Information

- Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages/QCEW
- Occupational Employment Statistics/OES
- Local Area Unemployment Statistics/LAUS
- Current Employment Statistics/CES
- Occupational Safety and Health Statistics/OSHS
- Workforce Information Grant/WIG (not BLS; USDOL Employment and Training Administration)



QCEW

- Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages
 - Quarterly count of employment and wages
 - 95% of US Jobs by industry
 - National
 - State
 - County
 - MSA

* This reporting is mandatory of all employers

OES

- Occupational Employment Statistics
 - Program produces employment and wage estimates annually for over 800 occupations.
 - Estimates available
 - National (also available by industry)
 - State
 - MSA
 - Non-Metro
 - Suppressed data
 - * This reporting is not mandatory of employers



LAUS

- Local Area Unemployment Statistics
 - Program produces monthly and annual employment, unemployment, and labor force data
 - Census regions and divisions
 - States
 - Counties
 - Metropolitan areas
 - And many cities, by place of residence.

* This reporting is not mandatory of employers



CES

- Current Employment Statistics
 - Monthly survey
 - 149,000 businesses and government agencies,
 - 651,000 individual worksites
 - Provides detailed industry data for all States, Territories & MSAs
 - Employment
 - Hours
 - Wages (non-farm)

* This reporting is not mandatory of employers



OSHS

- Occupational Safety and Health Statistics
 - Census of Fatal Occupational Injuries (CFOI)
 - Survey of Occupational Injuries and Illnesses (SOII)
 - Statistics
 - Incident type
 - Industry
 - Geography
 - Occupation
 - Annual collection
 - Work related injuries
 - Work related illnesses
 - Work related fatalities
 - * This reporting is mandatory of employers



WIG

Workforce Information Grant

- The Employment and Training Administration (ETA) workforce information grant TEGL (Training and Employment Guidance Letter) provides states the policy and program guidance for the development, management, and delivery of labor market and workforce information to the public, ETA and its agency customers.
- The core WIGs deliverables include:
 - An annual economic report : Analyzing the state's current labor market
 - Contributions to the national Workforce Information Database (WID)
 - Data dissemination services in virtual displays, electronic databases and hardcopy publications, and
 - An annual grant performance report detailing the deliverables produced.



Jobs4TN.gov

- Where it all comes together WID database
 - The Workforce Information Database (WID) stores
 - Employment statistics
 - Labor market information
 - Employer listings and related economic
 - Demographic data
- The Analyst Resource Center provides standards for common data nationwide.
- This database originated from the need for a single, multi-purpose structure to drive analytical and data display systems.
- Information Stored:
 - Industry
 - CES
 - Employer
 - Labor Force
 - Population
 - Geographic
 - License
 - Occupational Wages



Additional Uses for Data




- QCEW data was used to estimate how many businesses in path / flood zone

- QCEW data was used to estimate how many workers were affected by the solar eclipse Aug 21, 2017
- 321 U.S. counties in the path of totality
- 7.7 million jobs
- 482,000 establishments in this path


December 2016 employment in U.S. counties in the path of totality of the August 21, 2017, solar eclipse









Dashboards - Demographic Data






Dashboards - Labor Force Data






Dashboards – Unemployment Rates




Mobile App for Local Data
