Summary

Tennessee's March seasonally adjusted unemployment rate remained the same as the revised February rate of 3.4%.

Over the past year, Tennessee's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased from 4.2% to 3.4% while the national rate declined from 4.5% to 4.1%.

Total nonfarm employment increased 4,900 jobs from February to March. The largest increases occurred in accommodation/food services, wholesale trade, and transportation/warehousing/utilities.

Over the year, nonfarm employment increased 49,000 jobs. The largest increases occurred in leisure/hospitality, education/health services, and trade/transportation/utilities.
