



High School Equivalency Exam Recommendation Form

A candidate must be 18 years of age before being eligible to take the [High School Equivalency Exam]. A 17-year-old may be allowed to take the examination upon the recommendation of the local school superintendent. The superintendent may require written documentation from the applicant to support this recommendation. This rule should not be used to circumvent participation in the regular high school program. Tenn. Comp. R. & Regs. 0520-01-03-.06(6)(c).

The above rule does not require the recommendation of the director prior to a 17-year-old student enrolling in a High School Equivalency program. The recommendation is only to take the test. The above-referenced state law and rules contain no requirement that a 17-year-old student be enrolled in the school district before a director may recommend he or she be allowed to take the High School Equivalency Exam.
