

#### Workplace Injuries and Illnesses - Tennessee, 2021

Private industry employers reported 53,400 nonfatal workplace injuries in Tennessee in 2021, resulting in an incidence rate of 2.5 cases per 100 full-time equivalent workers.


#### **Key findings of the 2021 Survey of Occupational Injuries and Illnesses**

- Tennessee was among 12 states and the District of Columbia that had an incidence rate of total recordable cases (TRC) significantly less than the national rate of 2.7.
- TRC incidence rates in private industry ranged from 0.7 in information to 3.4 in education and health services.
- Three supersectors, with 55 percent of private industry employment, accounted for 77 percent of the occupational injuries and illnesses: trade, transportation, and utilities; education and health services; and manufacturing.
- In private industry, the TRC injury and illness incidence rate ranged from 1.9 for establishments employing 11 to 49 workers to 3.0 for establishments employing 1,000 or more workers.
- Of the 53,400 private industry injury and illness cases reported in Tennessee, 32,900 were of a more serious nature, involving days away from work, job transfer or restriction referred to as DART cases.
- In 2021, 45,600 (85.4 percent) of private industry recordable injuries and illnesses were injuries. Workplace illnesses accounted for an additional 7,800 recordable cases.
- In the state and local government sector in Tennessee, 10,500 injury and illness cases were reported in 2021, resulting in a rate of 3.5 cases per 100 full-time workers. Nationally, the rate was 4.5. Eighty-eight percent of injuries and illnesses reported in Tennessee's public sector occurred among local government workers.


#### Coronavirus (COVID-19) Pandemic Impact in SOII Results

Occupational injuries and illnesses collected in the 2021 SOII include cases of COVID-19 when a worker was infected as a result of performing their work-related duties and met other recordkeeping criteria. COVID-19 is considered a respiratory illness under criteria established by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA).

#### **Tennessee Census of Fatal Occupational Injuries (CFOI) - 2021**

There were 132 fatal work-related injuries in Tennessee during 2021, a decrease of 7 percent from the 142 recorded during 2020.

#### **Key findings of the 2021 Census of Fatal Occupational Injuries**

- There were 112 fatal occupational injuries to wage and salary workers and 20 to self-employed persons.
- There were 119 fatal injuries to men and 13 fatal work injuries to women.
- There were 86 fatal work injuries to White (non-Hispanic) workers, 26 to Black or African-American (non-Hispanic) workers, 14 to Hispanic or Latino workers and 6 to Asian (non-Hispanic) workers.
- The greatest number of fatal occupational injuries occurred to workers in the major occupational group of transportation and material moving workers with 48 fatalities.
- Workers between the ages of 45 and 54 years of age suffered the greatest number of work-related injuries with 35 fatalities.




## Number of fatal work-related occupational injuries Tennessee, 2012-2021
