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CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Good afternoon everyone.

We want to do a roll call for the Prevailing Wage Commission Hearing for May 14th, 2025. I will read the name off and please answer if you are present.

Gwen Whittaker?

MS. WHITTAKER: Here.

CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Ann McGauran.

MS. MCGAURAN: Here.

CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Scott Thompson.

MR. THOMPSON: Present.

CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Steven Wright.

MR. WRIGHT: Here.

CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Okay. So we have a quorum for today.

And I'm going to share a new announcement. It's already been stated if there is any public comments, you will need to sign the document there in the front of the room.

We've got a 2024, November 19th and 26th transcripts are now available and approved. And they will be on the agenda -- I'm sorry. These transcripts will be on the agenda to be approved at our September 11th meeting, okay, for those two meetings.

1 Let's have a motion to approve the agenda as it's
2 accepted. Do I have a motion?

3 MR. THOMAS: I would make that motion.

4 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: We have a motion. Do have a
5 second?

6 MR. WRIGHT: Second.

7 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: All right. All in favor of
8 accepting the agenda as listed, let it be known by stating
9 "aye."

10 (Affirmative response.)

11 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any opposed?

12 (No verbal response.)

13 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: The agenda is adopted and
14 approved.

15 We are going to move to our next agenda item, which
16 will be the review and approval of the revisions to the
17 Prevailing Wage Commission Rules. Are there any public
18 comments before review starts?

19 MS. MCGAURAN: Can you help walk people through the
20 steps of the rules getting approved?

21 MR. DEASON: So the way this goes is: We make the
22 amendments, draft up the amendments, consult with the
23 Attorney General's Office. The Attorney General's Office
24 weighs in and then we send them to the Governor's Office; but
25 both of those things have already been done. The Governor's

1 Office has approved that we can submit this current version.

2 We can make minor changes, nothing really
3 substantive or else we would have to come back and
4 reincorporate those. But I got no feedback from the
5 Governor's Office other than approved.

6 The AG's Office, we've been going back and forth
7 for a long time, basically for nitpicky stuff. Like you will
8 notice in here that we no longer had means "one who," because
9 they insisted that we needed to put one in parenthesis after
10 one, I disagree. So I just went through and changed
11 everywhere where it said "one who" means a person who. There
12 are little things like that.

13 I -- after the -- after today, a plan to, if you
14 guys approve these, I'm sending them directly to the
15 Secretary of State's Office to set this. We will have a
16 rulemaking hearing. And then after that, if there is public
17 comment, we have to submit those. If there is no public
18 comment, I submit that there was no one in attendance, no
19 comments at the hearing. And it gets on file at the
20 Secretary of State's Office. And then in a couple of months,
21 it becomes final. That's basically the steps in the process.

22 MS. MCGAURAN: Okay. But after this, there -- if
23 these are approved and then subsequently the approval
24 proceeds as expected, there is no further action for
25 this body?

1 MR. WRIGHT: Well, I approve it. This body
2 approves.

3 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: If there is no public comments,
4 the Chairman recognizes General Counsel to sort of lead the
5 discussion.

6 MR. DEASON: Before we do that, do you want us to
7 go around the room and have us introduce ourselves for...

8 I'm Chance Deason, General Counsel.

9 MS. OWENS: Melissa Owens, Deputy General Counsel.

10 MR. WRIGHT: Steve Wright, I think I am a
11 Commissioner.

12 MR. THOMPSON: Scott Thompson, Commissioner.

13 MS. WHITTAKER: Gwen Whittaker, TDOT Designee.

14 MS. MCGAURAN: Ann McGauran, State
15 Architect/Commissioner.

16 MR. HERROD: Tom Herrod, Assistant Commissioner.

17 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: And Dewayne Scott, Deputy
18 Commissioner.

19 MS. DIEFENBACH: Jamie Diefenbach, Executive Admin
20 Assistant.

21 MR. DEASON: Okay. All right. So my main goal
22 here today is not to make this too tedious like the last
23 time. So I think you will find looking at these that there
24 hasn't been -- there hasn't been really anything much in the
25 way of a substantive change to what we had before. A lot of

1 it has to do with my discussions with the AG's Office. There
2 were quite a few basically "stylistic changes," they wanted.
3 But they can hold this up if I don't come to an agreement
4 with them.

5 One thing I did want to mention in the definitions
6 of what you have there before you, I did not take out in
7 definitions 1(b), it says: "Commission means the Prevailing
8 Wage Commission." I took out, "Or its administrative
9 designee, the Tennessee Department of Labor and Workforce
10 Development." I think we were wanting to remove that, right
11 Tom?

12 MR. HERROD: Say that again.

13 MR. DEASON: Where it said: "Commission means the
14 Prevailing Wage Commission," I took out the rest of it where
15 it said: "Or the Tennessee Department of Labor and Workforce
16 Development or its administrative delegate." So that will
17 not be in there. I apologize that it didn't get in the one
18 we gave to you.

19 The rest of it, like I said, is pretty much the
20 same. We had a -- kind of a battle of semantics with the
21 AG's office. I don't think you will find the substance
22 changed pretty much at all.

23 So I just want to ask you all: Do you have any
24 questions, comments, concerns? Because I didn't plan on
25 going through these one by one and taking the rest of your

1 day.

2 MR. WRIGHT: I read it and I thought they were
3 great. I have no suggests, but I'm not a comma person, so I
4 don't know what...

5 MR. DEASON: Tom is. Tom dealt with the commas.

6 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: So is there a motion for any
7 discussions that need to occurred?

8 MS. MCGAURAN: I just have a quick question: There
9 are a bunch of packets in front of me. I have Prevailing
10 Wage Commission Rules Proposed Revisions, and then I have
11 this one, and then I have Notice of Rulemaking Hearing.
12 Which one of these are we voting on, which version?

13 MR. DEASON: The one -- they should be.

14 MR. HERROD: They are identical just in content.
15 The one that says, "Proposed Revision," was for you to see it
16 up here if there is any editing. This is an easier way to
17 edit from this copy than these, but it's the same -- same
18 verbiage throughout this.

19 MS. MCGAURAN: Well, but it -- but it's not. As I
20 look at (c), these two versions don't have the exact same
21 statement. The one that says, "Prevailing Wage Commission
22 Rules Proposed," and the one that says, "Labor and Workforce
23 Development Boilers, Elevators, Amusement Devices and other
24 Related Rules;" when you look at the definition for (c), they
25 don't match, that is --

1 MR. DEASON: For covered worker?

2 MS. MCGAURAN: For covered worker.

3 MR. HERROD: Well, this will be the one -- this is
4 an unofficial copy just for editing. This is the official
5 copy. This --

6 MR. DEASON: So this right here is what would be
7 filed in the Secretary of State's Office.

8 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Notice of Rulemaking.

9 MS. MCGAURAN: Okay. So that's --

10 MR. HERROD: That one is the one that I read.

11 MS. MCGAURAN: Okay. So that one, they do match.
12 This one right here, just for noted, the one you pulled up on
13 the screen, doesn't match the others.

14 MR. HERROD: Okay. Sorry about that. So throw
15 that on the floor. It will be discarded and we will vote on
16 this one.

17 MS. MCGAURAN: Okay. I just really want to make
18 sure --

19 MR. HERROD: That's what I get for trying to make
20 things easy.

21 MR. DEASON: Well, it is pretty critical you have
22 the right version.

23 MR. WRIGHT: If I can comment, I really think y'all
24 have done a great job with capturing the intend, as I
25 understood it, the important things here, the weights and the

1 machines, the operator reclassifications. As I said there, I
2 didn't see any, "Oh, we left out," or, "Oh, we shouldn't have
3 done this," in there.

4 In the thorough rereading there is a -- I am not
5 suggesting that there is a couple of things that we could
6 have taken out some antiquated language. But I think we got
7 to that last time. Instead of arguing what a dragline was,
8 we figured nobody owned one anyone way so it didn't matter.

9 MR. THOMPSON: And the weights were what was -- we
10 were trying to distinguish everything, that's what this is.

11 MR. WRIGHT: And we've got the trucks right it
12 appears to me. We have got the articulated trucks up there
13 with the heavy-equipment operator and then we have two
14 categories of -- of -- on highway trucks. Which Scott or
15 whoever figured that out, good job.

16 I mean, to me it looks like a really good document
17 for the State today.

18 MS. MCGAURAN: I don't have any concerns with that
19 clarification of which version worked for me.

20 MR. DEASON: Are you all ready for -- to a --

21 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any further discussion before
22 we --

23 MR. DEASON: Just for sake of the rules, did we
24 have the motion and the motion seconded to discuss?

25 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: We did not.

1 MR. WRIGHT: I would move that we adopt these.

2 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: This is just for the discussion,
3 Steve.

4 MS. MCGAURAN: So usually when we make a motion to
5 adopt it, then you say motion, second and any discussion and
6 then you vote on the motion.

7 MR. DEASON: That is the fine.

8 MR. WRIGHT: You have a motion to adopt these.

9 MS. MCGAURAN: Second.

10 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: So we have a first and the second
11 to adopt. Any discussion before the vote occurs?

12 MS. MCGAURAN: I think that is where you said you
13 felt like they were moving in the right direction and solving
14 all of the problems.

15 MR. WRIGHT: I think they have done a really nice
16 job. Congratulations to everybody's two years of hard work.
17 Thank you. It restores my faith in government.

18 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: That's big. That's big.

19 With so a first and a second, all in favor of
20 accepting the revisions of the Prevailing Wage Commission
21 Rules as submitted?

22 MR. DEASON: Could we take a voice vote, sir? I'm
23 sorry, I should have mentioned that to you. My apologies.

24 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Okay. Okay.

25 MR. DEASON: The you could call each one.

1 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: So we will ask for the voice vote
2 to approve this starting with Steve.

3 MR. WRIGHT: Aye.

4 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Scott.

5 MR. THOMPSON: Aye.

6 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Gwendolyn.

7 MS. WHITTAKER: Aye.

8 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: And Ann.

9 MS. MCGAURAN: Aye.

10 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: So we have the Prevailing Wages
11 Commission Rules accepted and passed by full majority.

12 Let's discuss -- give you an update on the
13 Prevailing meetings -- Wage meetings that's upcoming forth.
14 September 11th, we start the process. That there be at 1:30.
15 We have a second meeting on November 12th at 1:30. And final
16 meeting for this session will be November 18th at 1:30.

17 Any conflicts with anyone's schedule? You good
18 there?

19 MR. WRIGHT: September the 11th I'm out of the
20 country.

21 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Anyone else want to --

22 MR. HERROD: Is there any day that week you're
23 available?

24 MR. WRIGHT: Not that week, sir. Actually, I have
25 that on my calendar as the 4th. Did I put it down wrong?

1 MS. WHITTAKER: I have it on September 4th as well.

2 MR. WRIGHT: It's in my calendar as September 4th,
3 two times actually.

4 MR. HERROD: Can we --

5 MR. WRIGHT: And I am available September 4th. Is
6 every one else available September 4th.

7 MS. WHITTAKER: I am not, but I had it on my
8 calendar for that day as well.

9 MR. WRIGHT: It won't hurt my feelings if y'all
10 have it when I'm gone.

11 MR. HERROD: We are going to make you be there.

12 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: So we going to change that date to
13 the 4th?

14 MR. HERROD: So three of the four are available, I
15 think that is --

16 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: I think everybody had it on their
17 schedule on the 4th. November 12th work for everyone?

18 MR. WRIGHT: Yes.

19 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: And the 18th?

20 MR. WRIGHT: Yes.

21 MR. THOMPSON: Yes.

22 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Mr. Tom, if you would make those
23 changes and update that.

24 With no more discussions, we will consider
25 ourselves adjourned.
