

RESOLUTION OF THE TENNESSEE PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOL COMMISSION REGARDING TENNESSEE VOLUNTEER MILITARY ACADEMY AMENDED APPLICATION APPEAL

Whereas, pursuant to T.C.A. § 49-13-101 et. seq., Tennessee Volunteer Military Academy ("TVMA") submitted an appeal to the denial of its amended charter school application by the Memphis-Shelby County Schools Board of Education dated August 2, 2022 to the Tennessee Public Charter School Commission ("Commission"), which is charged with serving as an appellate authorizer beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, and;

Whereas, representatives of the sponsor of TVMA participated in a public hearing on September 22, 2022 to answer questions of the Commission staff and receive comment from members of the public in the proposed district, and;

Whereas, the Commission's Charter Review Committee, conducted a capacity interview on September 20, 2022, at which time representatives of Binghampton provided responses to questions from members of the Review Committee, and;

Whereas, the Commission, at a quarterly meeting on October 18, 2022, reviewed, discussed, and considered the full appeal record, review committee report, and Executive Director's recommendation prior to voting on a decision;

Whereas, the Commission, determined the following findings of fact:

- 1. TVMA does not meet the standard for academic plan design and capacity
- 2. TVMA does not meet the standard for operations plan and capacity
- 3. TVMA does not meet the standard for financial plan and capacity

However, be it resolved by the Tennessee Public Charter School Commission that the amended application for Tennessee Volunteer Military Academy is denied, pursuant to T.C.A. § 49-13-105(a).

Commissioner Smith moved for approval of the Resolution.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Hanson and, upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:

- 1. Commissioner Griscom voted aye;
- 2. Commissioner Hanson voted aye;
- 3. Commissioner Levine voted aye;
- 4. Commissioner Patterson voted aye;
- 5. Commissioner Richards voted aye;
- 6. Commissioner Smith voted aye;

- 8. Commissioner Woodson voted aye; and,
- 9. Commissioner Sisnett was recused from this vote.



The Chair thereupon declared that the resolution was duly passed and adopted on this 18th day of October 2022.

In accordance with T.C.A. \S 49-13-108(5)(D), the decision of the Commission is final and not subject to appeal.
